- Avoid direct physical confrontations with uncooperative, unruly, or emotionally disturbed person and report any misconduct immediately to Operations and a Supervisor for assistance.
- Perform any other related public safety task as assigned by GCP.

GCP Public Safety Officers must be able to:

- Work outdoors for prolonged periods of time including in inclement weather conditions.
- Engage in strenuous physical activity including foot patrolling, walking, running, and standing for extended periods.
- Work weekends and evening hours as required.
